> Re: Permit Amendment Application No. 21217 (Aaron Roberts, University of North Texas)

Dear Ms. Harrison:

The Marine Mammal Commission (the Commission), in consultation with its Committee of Scientific Advisors on Marine Mammals, has reviewed the above-referenced permit amendment application with regard to the goals, policies, and requirements of the Marine Mammal Protection Act (the MMPA). Dr. Roberts is authorized to import, receive, and possess samples from harp and hooded seals during a five-year period—permit 21217 expires on 30 November 2022. The purpose is to assess changes in molecular biomarkers, immune suppression, hormone concentrations, and overall health associated with exposure to polybrominated diphenyl ethers.

Dr. Roberts proposes to increase the total number of samples to be imported during the five-year period from 30 each for harp and hooded seals to 60 each. Samples have been and would be obtained from permitted researchers in Canada. <u>The Commission</u> believes that the proposed activities are consistent with the purposes and policies of the MMPA and therefore <u>recommends</u> that the National Marine Fisheries Service issue the permit amendment, provided that the current permit conditions remain in effect.
