Dear Ms. Harrison:

The Marine Mammal Commission (the Commission), in consultation with its Committee of Scientific Advisors on Marine Mammals, has reviewed the above-referenced permit application with regard to the goals, policies, and requirements of the Marine Mammal Protection Act (the MMPA). Mr. Massyn is requesting authorization to conduct filming activities on pinnipeds off the coasts of Oregon and California for a National Geographic documentary that highlights predator-prey relationships in the Pacific Ocean.

Mr. Massyn is requesting authorization to film adult and juvenile northern elephant seals and California sea lions of either sex during a two-year period. Harbor seals also could be harassed incidental to the filming activities. Mr. Massyn would implement various measures to minimize impacts on pinnipeds and also would be required to abide by the National Marine Fisheries Service's (NMFS) standard permit conditions. After Mr. Massyn's application published in the *Federal Register*, he requested to film Steller sea lions as well. The Commission understands that NMFS plans to process that request as an amendment to the permit shortly after the permit is issued. The Commission believes that the proposed activities are consistent with the purposes and policies of the MMPA and recommends that NMFS issue the permit and the associated amendment, as requested.
