

The Marine Mammal Commission and World Wildlife Fund (WWF) invite you to a Congressional briefing focused on <u>marine mammal bycatch</u>. The goal of this event is to increase awareness of the threat to marine mammals from bycatch in fisheries around the world, and to discuss potential solutions to mitigate such impacts in the United States and abroad.

Bycatch is the number one source of direct human-caused mortality and serious injury to marine mammals, estimated at over 650,000 individual animals each year worldwide. As a major market for globally-sourced seafood, the United States is in a unique position to help address marine mammal bycatch globally. This topic is now more pressing than ever, as we may see another marine mammal (the vaquita) go extinct in the next few years because of bycatch resulting from inadequate regulatory measures to protect the species.
